The District is accepting nominations for awards in the following categories: buffer, energy conservation, grassland management, outstanding young conservationist, soil conservation, water conservation, water quality and/or quantity, wildlife habitat and windbreak.

Annual Cost-Share Sign-up Begins

The Shawnee County Conservation District is taking FY-2024 Water Resources and Non-Point Source (NPS) state cost-share applications beginning April 14, 2023. Applications will be accepted until funds are exhausted. Once applications are received, they will be prioritized within a group based on a point system designed solely for water quality. Approval will be made at the July board meeting assuming technical assistance is available to meet this deadline. Projects already started or completed are *not* eligible for funding.

The cost-share for practices funded at a set payment rate up to the project limit which varies upon the type of project. Funding will not exceed landowner actual cost. Some areas of the county are designated as high priority.

Please call (785) 338-9946 for more details on Cost-Share programs and application details. All practices must be properly maintained for a minimum of ten years. *Funding provided by the Kansas Department of Agriculture/Division of Conservation through appropriations from the Kansas Water Fund.*

District Manager

The District Manager performs various administrative duties for the Shawnee County Conservation District located in the USDA Service Center in Topeka, Kansas.

This position administers and carries out policies and operates within the guidelines set forth by the Board of Supervisors in an organized and effective manner. The District Manager provides day-to-day coordination of District activities unsupervised and serves as the District's representative to other agencies, organizations and the general public which entails conservation education. In addition to working for the District, the District Manager shall, within the range of duties and hours of work set by the Board of Supervisors, be directed to provide support services for the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) located in the same office.

This position is classified as permanent full time with salary and benefits agreed upon by the Board of Supervisors. Weekday and daytime are the primary work hours with occasional evenings, weekends and overnight stays. The District Manager will need to hold a valid driver's license with mileage reimbursement available during official District duties.

Knowledge of conservation practices preferred, but not required. General knowledge of office procedures, computer software (Word, Excel, PowerPoint & Publisher) and bookkeeping procedures using *Quickbooks* is preferred but training will be provided.
